RecyGlo's research and development team implemented and completed a biogas plant for the Inle Horse Club. With splendid views over the Inle Lake, Inle Horse Club has been our host and partner to support this project all along the way, which is a referent for the community regarding environmentally clean solutions.



The biogas is released from the fermentation of horse manure and biodegradable organic waste. Not only biogas was obtained, but also the outlets of the sludge can be kept as bio-fertilizer for the farms. The biogas will be used at Inle Horse Club to cook their delicious meals, which we really recommend, and they will be able to use the remnants to continue planting a tree per customer. You should definitely check it out!

This is a special project in which we are making the best solution for waste while obtaining the maximum value out of it. We hope to not only contribute to Inle Horse Club but to the community as they will now have access to cheap, valuable bio-fertilizer.

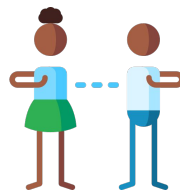
